## Find a tick on you? Brush it off Is the tick attached to your skin? Remove it right away



- Use tweezers to grab the tick as close to your skin as possible.
- Pull the tick firmly, straight out, and away from your skin (DO NOT twist, burn, or smother the tick).
- Wash your hands and the bite area with soap and water after the tick is removed, and apply an antiseptic to the bite area.
- 4 See your doctor if you develop a rash or flu-like symptoms within 30 days after a tick bite.
